ARCHIVE AND STORAGE PROJECT

We received a generous grant from First Federal and from the Oregon Parks and Rec for the purpose of improving our storage of artifacts and creating an improved record of the items the museum has received. The heart of this project has been a new computer program. While the program is rather difficult to learn and use, one of our members, Donna Firestone, has taken the lead on learning the program and educating other volunteers.

The other part of this project has been to improve how we store and inventory items, especially fragile newspapers. We have inventoried all the newspapers and we know their exact location. The inventory list is available in our Research Area so any visitor who would like to view a particular paper, it can be easily accessed.

This is a long-term project. As outlined in the grant requirements, the majority of the work must be completed by May 2022.
