HISTORICAL TIDBIT

The Dickey Family Heritage

John Dickey married Sarah Noel in 1821 and they had 10 children. Sarah passed away in 1842 and John married Elizabeth Lynch, a widow with 10 children. John and Elizabeth added 4 more children to the family. In 1853, John and Elizabeth, along with 5 sons and 5 daughters, came to Oregon via covered wagon along the Oregon Trail and they took up a donation land claim just east of Mill Creek in Polk County. Other members of this family were already in Oregon. In 1854, John and Elizabeth along with her sons, Aaron, John and Joseph Lynch, organized the Union Baptist Church which was located between Buell and Sheridan.

Thomas Jefferson Dickey was born in 1825 in Tennessee, and he married Narcissa Reed in 1848. He and his older brother John E. came to Oregon in 1851 to see what all the fuss was about. They liked what they saw and immediately returned to bring their families to Oregon. Thomas, Narcissa and their 2-year-old son, John, joined a wagon train in 1852 which was led by his older brother James Noel Dickey. They arrived in Sheridan in the fall of 1852 and took up a donation land claim just 3 miles west of Buell. They had 8 children.

Evander (Van) Dickey born in 1870 was their 6th child and he married Elizabeth McGhie. Their son, Glen W. Dickey, was born in 1898 and he married Helen Chapman, daughter of Frank Chapman and granddaughter of William and Esther Lorinda Chapman. Glen and Helen had a son, Glen W. Jr. in 1926. Glen married Phyllis Thomson. Glen and Phyllis assumed the operation of the farm (part of the original donation land claim of William Chapman). They had 4 children (Glynnis, Deborah, Vane and Vanessa).

After 170 years, the farm is still in the Dickey family.
