HISTORICAL TIDBIT

History of E.W. Haas Drugstore

On May 1, 1907, Ernest Haas and his brother John purchased the Arthur Caine Pharmacy which was located near the bridge on S. Bridge Street. Ernest married Letitia Jackson on November 25, 1909 and made their home above the store. Both brothers spoke German extremely well which helped serve the Sheridan community where many residents spoke German.

The Haas brothers operated the store together until early 1913 when Ernest bought out his brother. On July 18, 1913, tragedy struck when the largest fire in Sheridan's history burned the entire business district on South Bridge Street. Everything between the bridge and the railroad tracks was destroyed. For the young Haas family, they also lost their home. Ernest only saved one thing from burning -- his old cash register which is now on display at the museum.

Following the fire, Ernest opened a temporary pharmacy on East Main and had it running in just 5 days. Fred Sackett was putting up a building at 226 S Bridge, but he decided that he wanted his mercantile closer to the bridge, so Ernest purchased the building from him, and it was completed in 1914. Ernest moved all the merchandise from his temporary store across the bridge to the new location using a wheelbarrow. The new facility had two business spaces on the ground floor. EW Haas Drug Co occupied one and J.O. Yocom Confectionery the other. The second floor had office space and several apartments.

Ernest and Letitia had two daughters, Loisel (Bride) and Iola (Meyers) who both became pharmacists. Ernest passed away in October 1943. Letitia and Loisel continue to operate the drug store until 1945 when Iola and Harold Meyers assumed operation of the drug store. The family continued operation under the name of Meyers Rexall Drug.

Following the death of Iola and Harold, Loisel operated the drug store until 1977. The business had been in the Haas family for 70 years.
